

us by MAPS.





MAITLAND HEALTH CENTRE

The Maitland Health Centre (MHC) board held its AGM on November 27th at 7.30 pm in the waiting room of its facility at Robert St Maitland. The health centre comprises two buildings adjacent to the hospital but independent of the hospital which are community owned and run by a governing board. This facility has been running since the late 1990s.

The MHC is a not for profit organisation run by board members on a voluntary basis, with all monies raised reinvested in the facility's upkeep. They employ a co-ordinator part time to help with its running and to oversee its accounts. The main function of the board is to rent out the premises to medical practitioners, allied health professionals, government health agencies and an expanding dental facility. They oversee the upkeep of the premises and to expand its facilities where possible to provide other health services for Maitland and the surrounding community.

The Maitland community should indeed be proud of this facility for such a small community. Of course, such a facility would not be possible without donations from the public in the early days and to the hard work of volunteers. Two such board members in Chairman Clive Kelly and board member Colin Sandercock were recognised at the AGM for their outstanding contribution to the MHC. Both have served on the board for over 15 years, their roles have been numerous, Clive as Chairman and Colin as a builder volunteering his expertise. They have overseen and contributed their own labour to the expansion of the

facility and most weeks can be seen attending to the various maintenance issues or attending to the garden. They were presented with a plaque which is to be hung prominently on the waiting room wall to recognise their efforts.

Thanks to the efforts of people like Clive and Colin the MHC is in a strong position to grow and serve the community.

Our 2024 Maitland Show is fast approaching and the committee has been working hard to put together a jam-packed program for the enjoyment of show-goers.

If you haven't already, it is time to start preparing your entries for the various competitions. Last year we had almost record-breaking numbers of entries in several categories. Due to some confusion last year, I would like to draw photography entrants' attention to the required size of photos. All photos must be 5" x 7" except panoramic which must be 4"x12". The closing date for photographs is Saturday 11^{th} March as they are judged off-site.

This year magician, Dane Certificate will join the line up of entertainment for show day. Dane is known as Dane Certificate in the world of illusion – an inventor and creator of wonders who has travelled the world with his magic. "The Great Dane" will bring his classic illusions and new magic for all ages. He will teach children a couple of tricks they can do themselves to amaze friends and family.



The Maitland Ute Muster will once again be a part of this year's show. We will welcome utes from all over the state for the Muster which is an opportunity for enthusiastic ute owners to show off their vehicles which are often personalised with a variety of items. There is a range of categories for ute owners to enter including best work vehicle, best classic ute, best chick's ute, as well as the champion ute.

We will again host a Young Farmers' Challenge and have a display of Vintage and Classic vehicles by the Maitland Auto Preservation Society.

The Jim Hermel Band will return to deliver dynamic versions of old classics and goodtime tunes that they have built their reputation on, rocking out vibrant songs. Don Morrison who has shared the stage with many of the biggest names in Australian music, is a songwriter, singer, guitarist, story teller, author and guitar maker. Don will bring his own brand of Australian Blues, Roots & Folk to the 2024 Maitland Show. Also in the entertainment lineup we have Harvest Moon who are a local acoustic duo from Minlaton. Meggie and Damien play a smooth mix of acoustic tunes. Plan to stay around for dinner on show day and soak up the ambiance.



Quadriders SA who wowed the crowd last year will be returning to do it all again. They will be sharing the Elias Smith Oval with the ever-popular Gary Baxter and his V8 utes which will once again be vying for a win at Maitland. The Rockabout 8m Rock Climbing Wall which has been very popular in previous years will be returning. As will the Animals Anonymous team. They will again be presenting a range of friendly Australian native animals. Don't miss their interactive animal display.

The show committee appreciates the Cougars Netball Club once again allowing us to use their courts on show day. This area will again house the very popular Kids' Zone. This is an area packed with many free activities for children to enjoy including Pedal Karts, Hula Hoop Toss, AFL/Soccer Darts, the Arena IPS, Axe Throw (Kids safe version), R/Control Cars and Remote-Control Truck Display. At the other end of the grounds in the School Shed we will have a kids play dough table and face painter. Outside of the School Shed kids will find a giant sand pit filled with toys.



This year, thanks to sponsorship from the Ardrossan, Maitland, Kiplings & Vili's Bakeries and Triple B Café at Wallaroo, the Maitland Show will be again hosting the popular Sausage Roll Competition. There is some great prize money on offer for the winner and 2 runners up of both the adult and junior competitions so its time to brush up on your sausage roll making skills.

As usual we will be running the CWA Scone Competition, the winner of which will go on to compete at Association level with a chance to compete at the Royal Adelaide Show. Information regarding this competition is also in the show book.

Maitland will host the semi-final of the Rich Fruit Cake Championship with the winner being eligible to compete in the State Final to be held at the Royal Adelaide Show in September. Further information on this competition is available in the show book.
