

If you attend any of the working bees you are invited to stay overnight in the Stenhouse Hall on the Tuesday night. This will be a great opportunity to meet and socialise together with a sausage sizzle provided for dinner. Friends members who live locally are also invited to come to the dinners at the Hall. The Polygala working bees are additional to the normal Friends working bee program. Friends working bees may include a range of activities like sand dune stabilisation, revegetation, landscaping and trail maintenance.

#### Polygala myrtifolia / Myrtleleaf Milkwort

Polygala myrtifolia is a garden escapee that infests the area in the Dhilba Guuranda – Innes National Park between Stenhouse bay and the park entrance near Marion Bay. It occurs mainly in the low coastal shrubland and highly disturbed areas. Polygala outcompetes native

plants and reduces the vegetation condition which impacts the functionality and habitat quality of the native ecosystem.

Generally Polygala seeds are dispersed by ants however, spread is quicker on roadsides so road verging, grading, as well as water runoff may be contributing factors.



Polygala is a declared weed and land managers are obligated to take reasonable steps to kill plants and prevent its spread. If unmanaged, Polygala has the potential to spread further South West into the park (towards

Gulawulgawi Ngunda Nhagu/Cape Spencer Lookout) and compromise large areas of good condition low coastal shrub land. This could negatively impact the availability of suitable habitat for many of the important native animals who make their homes in the park.



These Polygala working bees form part of a larger strategic plan to confine the weed to its current distribution in the park. This also involves work by Rangers, Volunteer Rangers, Seasonal Fire Crew, School groups and contractors. Treatment methods by volunteers will likely involve hand pulling and cutting and swabbing. Working bees will be adapted to be suitable for people with varying individual physical abilities however the ability to walk on uneven

surfaces is required as well as the wearing of closed in footwear.







On the 17th of March 55 members, former members and respective partners gathered at the Yorke Valley Hotel to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the formation of the Maitland Rifle Club which received official permission to form a rifle club from the army in April 1948, subsequently approval to "proceed with shooting practices" was granted 9 December 1948 and the first official shoot took place on the 5 February 1949.

We were lucky to have eleven past members travel from as far away as Brisbane, Adelaide, Coomandook, Strathalbyn and northern YP to join with us and help mark the occasion.

Captain Roger Francis welcomed everyone, read out the apologies who couldn't make the afternoon and also read the names of current Life Members present.

A display of the club's championship trophies along with photos going back over 50 years showing all manner of milestone events in the clubs past, plus a video montage of historical photos playing on the big screen added plenty of interest to the afternoon.

We waited till everyone had finished their meal then called on Peter Hill who joined MRC in 1954 and left Maitland in 1973 to go farming in Queensland to reminisce on his time in the club in the early years.

Eric March then gave us a brief rundown on his time in the club re team shooting and being coached as new shooter, his time with us culminating around 1973/74.

Current member Bill Gillis, who joined the club in 1973, then gave us an insight into some of the major upgrades to our facilities and accomplishments in team shooting in state wide competitions.

Roger Francis then touched on a few of the memorable things that happened in the early 70s as well, noting that as a club we are lucky to be a tight knit group with many talents which help to keep the club functioning in an admirable way, also recognising the important trophy sponsors we have supporting the club.

With the official part of the afternoon over we took the opportunity to have photographs of the visiting past members and then the current members who were present, followed by a bit of catching up and socializing. Thanks to all who attended.


