145th Maitland Show

Saturday 16th March

The Maitland Show Committee has once again put together a fantastic line-up of entertainment and activities for our show day.

The gates will open to the public at 9am. This year we will again not be running the usual horses in action to begin the day. The street parade through the main street of Maitland will begin at 10.00am. For those planning to take part in the parade mustering is at Pioneer Park from 9.30am

We will have a number of MAPS vehicles join the parade, after which they will be on display on the grounds.

The 2024 Maitland Show will be officially opened at 12.15pm by Belinda Cay. Among other things, Belinda, who lives on a farm, is an ag science communicator and a board member of the Royal Agricultural and Horticultural Society of SA. Before and after the official opening choirs/bands from the local schools will entertain show goers with a variety of musical items.

MAITLAND SHOW UTE MUSTER

The Ute Muster is on again! With flags flying and bull bars shining, everyone is welcome. Straw Mulch Fundraiser

Granny Mays Cookery Spiced Apple Pudding

INGREDIENTS

2 green apples

1 cup S.R. flour

1/3 cup sugar

1 egg, beaten

2oz butter, melted

1 cup hot water

2 tb spn brown sugar

1 oz butter, extra

1 tspn mixed spice



METHOD

Peel, core & slice apples thinly. Sift flour into basin, stir in sugar, beaten egg & melted butter. Mix until well combined. Stir in apples thoroughly. Place into greased 3 pint oven proof dish.

Combine hot water, brown sugar, spice & extra butter in a dish. Stir until butter is melted.

Pour over apple pudding mixture. Bake in a 180° oven for 30 minutes.

Editorial

END OF AN ERA

This issue of The S.A. Farmer is the two thousand two hundred and fifty-fourth since publication was commenced. It marks the end of an era. But it could be also said to herald an even better and more exciting one. Next week, under the mast-head Yorke Peninsula Country Times, a larger publication begins. Readers will have more to read in a bulkier newsy paper. Advertisers will get the benefits of the combined circulations of two first rate country papers in one.

The Farmer, founded by Mr. H. W. Tossell in 1923, captured, as he intended, a predominantly primary producer readership. He was a farmer himself, at Maitland, and he knew what farmers wanted. With a wide literary background and a passion for the Australian poets, he was aided by his wife, the former Grace Martin, who was a Tennyson medallist. This husband and wife team for a quarter of a century turned out The Farmer and set new literary standards for country newspapers in South Australia, and they have continued to work on it ever since. They have been assisted by a legion of reporters, people who have frequently reached sublime heights of public spiritedness in promoting their communities.

The title we relinquish today will have always nostalgic memories for Horace and Grace Tossell, who reside at Prospect. Their interest in the production of their newspaper has never varied. We feel The Farmer will leave nostalgic memories also for readers. Some have taken the paper since its first issue and many more for long periods. The Farmer bows out with many thanks to them, to its numerous reporters and to the numberless advertisers who helped assure its vigour over almost half a century. And it reappears on the other side of the stage to take its place as a strong member of the cast of the new presentation September 4th of Yorke Peninsula Country Times.

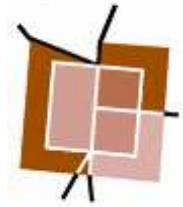
