WHAT'S NEW AT THE MARKET





As the weather cools down things are in no way slowing up at the Maitland Markets. We have had a wide range of new products and sellers who have joined us recently. To help give you the opportunity to visit, we are opening some Saturdays as well as our regular Thursdays and Fridays, 10am - 2pm each day.



In May we celebrate the work of the many volunteers who contribute to the Maitland community. Without them there would be some important services missing in our area. There is such a wide range of volunteer roles involving people in a broad range of age groups and backgrounds. With so many in Maitland chances are you already are or know a volunteer. National Volunteer week is an annual celebration and this year it is from the 20th to the 26th of May and is themed 'Something for Everyone'

Here are just some examples of the volunteer roles available in Maitland. The South Australian **Country Fire Service (CFS)** and South Australian **State Emergency Service (SES)** are the two volunteer agencies that provide emergency services support to our communities. These emergency service volunteers play a vital role because they are willing to protect our community in times of natural disasters and emergencies.

Emergency service volunteers carry out a range of different roles. These include: Conducting searches, fighting fires, operating radios, helping contain chemical spills, dealing with storm and flood damage, road crash rescue, marine rescue and providing support to the Metropolitan Fire Service (MFS), **South Australian Ambulance Service** (SAAS) and South Australian Police (SAPOL).

There are many benefits to this type of volunteering with the necessary training and equipment to carry out the role provided, as well as opportunities for meeting new people, developing teamwork and leadership skills and having fun.

Did you know that your local ambulance service **(SAAS)** is staffed by volunteers? There are no paramedics based in Maitland but an enthusiastic team of volunteers who undertake regular training to have the clinical skills to man the ambulance. They roster themselves when they are available but can undertake day to day activities unless they are paged to respond to an ambulance case. Most patients are people with chest pain, breathing problems or pre-existing medical conditions. Of course they sometimes have to deal with serious injuries but these are a small portion of the work. Training prepares them for these situations. No previous medical knowledge is required and this is a great way to meet new people and develop new skills that are extremely beneficial in everyday life.

Other medical related roles include those on the YP health advisory board, the health centre board and the CYP Friends of the Hospital. Maitland also has a volunteer Meals on Wheels service available for those who need it. Keen to help and have an interest in retail? **Vinnies**, the Society of St Vincent De Paul has a store in Maitland and is always looking for more helpers. The society aims to make a real difference in the lives of people who are disadvantaged or living in poverty. The Vinnies store supports their projects. There is also the **Community Corner Op Shop** run by the **Progress Association** with proceeds going back in to the community, as well as the **Maitland markets** which are on every week also offering morning teas and a place to meet with friends. Near the markets you will also find the **Men's Shed**.

Or is it the **Maitland Show** that interests you? This annual event on the third Saturday in March is planned, organised and run by a team of dedicated volunteers. There is a wide range of roles such as managing entries, convening the many competitions, judging entries such as cakes, jams, needlework or flowers, organising the Ute Muster or the Young Farmers Challenge, helping in the Pumpkin Kitchen, mustering the street parade or ground crew setting up and pulling down stalls etc. This major town event is run solely by volunteers. They are always looking for extra help on the committee.

The Apex, Lions, Country Women's and Rotary Clubs are all well known as important service clubs whose activities include fundraising projects, awareness raising, support for those who need it, as well as fellowship. Their work goes beyond the local community fostering goodwill, cooperation and understanding. They also help at community events such as ANZAC day, Christmas markets and the Show. All are seeking new members to carry on this tradition and support them in their many projects. History buffs can get involved in the CYP National Trust branch of the Maitland Museum and help to preserve and also share this valuable history.

So let's celebrate our volunteers in May. This special event is an opportunity to highlight the important role of volunteers in our community and invites people not currently volunteering to give it a go. It is a celebration of the diverse passions and talents everyone brings to volunteering. Whether you're drawn to environmental causes, community welfare, education, sport or beyond, there's a place where your unique skills and interests can flourish.

Baklava Bliss Roles

1 cup pistachios 1 cup almonds

Plus extra 1/2 cup chopped finely 1 cup walnuts

250g dried figs 1/4 tsp ground cloves

1/4 tsp ground cinnamon zest of one orange

1/4 tsp orange blossom water 1/3 cup honey

Method

Place all the ingredients in a food processor and whiz until mixture comes together and is smooth.

Using slightly damp hands roll a tbsp of mixture into balls.

Place extra chopped pistachios in a shallow bowl and roll each ball in the nuts and coat.

Serve immediately, or keep in an airtight container in the fridge for up to a week.

No Parking Problems

Recent community feedback has indicated there are concerns that a Yorke Peninsula Council car park rule was preventing new businesses from being established in the Maitland main street district. Council has provided the following information to clarify a number of misconceptions in relation to parking.

Firstly, there have been no new business applications in Maitland refused due to parking requirements.

New businesses are encouraged by Council and can be facilitated in most existing buildings within the main street. Except where it is a food related business (which have a number of additional health requirements), approval is often not required to open a shop where the previous use of the building was a shop; however, it is best to enquire with Council before starting a new business venture to receive assistance and guidance on the above.

In circumstances where development approval is required from a new business, parking is a consideration, although not being able to satisfy the on-site vehicle car parking requirements does not necessarily prohibit the development, and assessment will take in to account the availability of onstreet car parking and shared use of other parking areas.

To reiterate, no new business applications in the Maitland main street have been refused due to parking.

Further to this, Council has endorsed a Maitland Main Street Master Plan that will look to develop and improve parking and pedestrian access in support of local businesses in the town. Council is actively seeking grant funding to bring this project to fruition and help the Maitland business district thrive.

Council also offers a wide range of additional business support including Business Grants, assistance with State/Federal grants, workshops and networking opportunities. 




ELC VISIT TO PORT VICTORIA
